

Wreaths Across America Honoring Veterans Interred at the New Mexico Santa Fe National Veterans Cemetery

The Albuquerque MOAA Chapter was represented and participated in the decoration of gravestones and markers, and remembering veterans who gave the ultimate sacrifice and those who have passed-on and are interred at the Santa Fe National Veterans Cemetery. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, veterans all across America were honored by the Wreaths Across America and local sponsors and volunteers at veterans and designated public cemeteries the entire week of December 12 to 19, 2020. On Friday and Saturday, December 18 and 19, 2020, interred services veterans were honored at the Santa Fe National Veterans Cemetery. By placing sponsored seasonal fir wreaths and boughs at headstones and markers, over 2,100 interred veterans were honored from the over 62,000 grave sites withing the Santa Fe National Veterans Cemetery. I would like to thank the MOAA members, surviving spouses, family members, and specifically the daughters of our member veterans who came out to participate and lay wreaths on a sunny, but chilly and windy day at the Santa Fe National Veterans Cemetery.

Seventeen VA medical centers began a clinical trial for the single-dose investigational COVID-19 vaccine developed by the Janssen Pharmaceutical Companies of Johnson & Johnson. This is the fourth large-scale COVID-19 vaccine trial in the United States.

You can help.

If you are interested in participating in the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine clinical trial at the New Mexico Veteran Administration Health Care System, sign up for VA's coronavirus research volunteer list at www.va.gov/coronavirus-research. Anyone over the age of 18 can volunteer: Veterans, friends and family of Veterans, and VA staff. You may be called if you seem like a good fit for the trial.

What it means to volunteer.


When you join <u>VA's coronavirus research volunteer list</u>, you're **not enrolling** in the clinical trial. You're simply making yourself available to be called if this trial or other COVID-19 research at VA seem like a good fit for you. Once you've had the chance to speak with the study team, and ask all your questions, you can decide whether or not you want to join. We want you to be informed and make the right decision for you.

You **cannot** get COVID-19 from the investigational vaccine or the placebo used as part of the study. The investigational vaccine will not increase your risk of COVID-19.



New Mexico 2021 Legislative Session

- ⇒ The 55th Legislative session meets from January 19th at noon until March 20th at noon.
- ⇒ Legislation can be pre-filed from January 4th until January 15th.
- ⇒ What will the 2021 Session be like?
 - As of this writing, December 24th, it is anybody's guess.
 - Discussions are ongoing within the Legislative Council.
 - Thirty-nine Senators and Representative comprise the Legislative Council
 - The last Council meeting was December 14th. The agenda consisted of per diem approval for the upcoming session, session committee approval, redistricting working group and 2021. Meeting minutes have not been published.
 - The New Mexico Constitution requires the legislature to hold its session at the seat of the government. To that end, discussions have taken place with respect to a virtual session. In order to comply with social distancing, there is consideration for holding committee meetings in the Santa Fe Convention Center. This would allow the public, in limited numbers, to attend committee meetings.
 - Consideration is being given to limiting the number of bills per member to five.
 - The financial situation for New Mexico is not as bleak as was anticipated during the special session in June 2020. Revenue estimates the state could have from \$6.8 to \$7.6 billion for the up coming budget year. The current budget is \$7.2 billion.

Stay in contact with your legislator before, during and after session

- ⇒ There are a relatively large number of new legislators for the 2021 session. Ten new representatives and seven new senators amounting to a 25 percent turnover.
- ⇒ The list of legislators has not been published on the legislature website.
- ⇒ Remember there are tutorials on the Legislature Website
 - On the Home page, open Quick Links and click Website Video Tutorials
 - Videos are available on Finding Legislation and Finding Your Legislators and MyRoundhouse.
